FIRST LESSON Jeremiah 7:1-7

- **1** This is the word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD:
- **2** "Stand at the gate of the LORD's house and there proclaim this message: Hear the word of the LORD, all you people of Judah who come through these gates to worship the LORD.
- **3** This is what the LORD Almighty, the God of Israel, says: Reform your ways and your actions, and I will let you live in this place.
- **4** Do not trust in deceptive words and say, "This is the temple of the LORD, the temple of the LORD, the temple of the LORD!"
- **5** If you really change your ways and your actions and deal with each other justly, **6** if you do not oppress the foreigner, the fatherless or the widow and do not shed innocent blood in this place, and if you do not follow other gods to your own harm, **7** then I will let you live in this place, in the land I gave your ancestors for ever and ever."

#### SECOND LESSON

#### **1 Corinthians 9:16-23**

**16** For when I preach the gospel, I cannot boast, since I am compelled to preach. Woe to me if I do not preach the gospel! **17** If I preach voluntarily, I have a reward; if not voluntarily, I am simply discharging the trust committed to me. **18** What then is my reward? Just this: that in preaching the gospel I may offer it free of charge, and so not make full use of my rights as a preacher of the gospel. **19** Though I am free and belong to no one, I have made myself a slave to everyone, to win as many as possible.

- **20** To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win the Jews. To those under the law I became like one under the law (though I myself am not under the law), so as to win those under the law.
- **21** To those not having the law I became like one not having the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law), so as to win those not having the law.
- **22** To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some.
- 23 I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings.

**BIBLE STUDY POSSIBILITIES** -- Dates: Sunday Mornings, Feb. 21 – April 4 (6-7 sessions) In no particular order or preference, the following are studies of 5-6 weeks each.

- 1. QUESTIONS THAT JESUS ASKED a good Lenten focus on Christ & our relationship to Him. Why are you so afraid? Are you leaving me too? Who do you say that I am? ... and more such questions from the life of Christ
- 2. FORGING OUR CHURCH INTO A CARING COMMUNITY God's vision for a Christian congregation with motivation from God's love for us in Christ. Includes direction for caring for ourselves, fellow members and our community.
- 3. FAITH ADDRESSES THE PROBLEM OF WORRY Discussion of why we worry, particular worries that trouble us (society, security, family); worries about our eternal future. Learn how Christ and God's Word creates a faith to handle all these.
- **4. JONAH** An in-depth study of God's reluctant missionary, God's concern for the lost, and our own zeal to reach the lost.
- **5.** Christ's Love Demonstrated in Efficacy of the Means of Grace A study of sin and grace, law and gospel, and how God conveys His love and forgiveness to us through Word and Sacraments. This study was written by Seminary Prof. John Brenner.
- **6. Angelology** A study of God's special beings, their role in Scripture and in our lives today.
- 7. Satan and the Demons The opposite of the above a look at the Tempter and his followers. Scripture references to these evil ones and how they war against God's children today.
